NOTES:

-- Types of meetings and sessions:

PANEL SESSIONS -- professionally moderated educational panels consisting of several experts presenting their current work and views; audience will have opportunity for question and discussion.

BRIEFINGS -- a single expert will presenting important background on a selected topic; audience will have opportunity for question and discussion afterwards if time permits.

STRATEGY WORKSHOPS -- professionally moderated working group sessions designed to develop a unified international action plan on uranium weapons issues; participation is "by-invitation and prior approval only" of Conference planning groups (contact the Conference Planners for information on how to participate in these structured sessions); advance materials may be made available prior to the Conference for preparation for these workshops; each session will be required to develop action plans, and report these to the entire Conference for review; all strategy workshop participants will have opportunities to have input and participate in the work plans developed.

PLENARY SESSIONS: professionally moderated large group sessions of all participants, designed to develop and approve a unified action plan on uranium weapons issues; participation is "by-invitation and prior approval only" of Conference planning groups (contact the Conference Planners for information on how to participate).

AD HOC SESSIONS: space and time will be made available for participants to form their own sessions and meetings as needed. Information about these will be announced daily and be available at the Registration Desk. Groups are urged to use evening times, or times not in competition with scheduled Conference meetings and sessions.

-- **The Conference will be videotaped** and sent by live-feed over the Internet. A person's attendance at any session is therefore voluntary and constitutes granting the Conference informed consent to be filmed, permission for the Conference to use any reproduction of any Conference session as they deem appropriate; and a waiver on the part of the attendee for any compensation for or legal action against the Conference and/or its representatives for any reason regarding such use. Those not wishing to be on tape/camera agree to sit in designated areas only.

-- **Video Schedule:** Videos will be shown in the video room throughout the Conference. Consult the video schedule at the Registration Desk for times and titles.

-- **Photo Exhibition:** A special photo exhibition on the effects of DU will be available free of charge to the public.

-- **Facilitators/Moderators:** The Conference will provide professionally trained facilitators and moderators who are informed about the issues to help keep each session on topic and to moderate the use of the time, and, in the case of the Workshops and Plenary Sessions, to insure that the Conference completes its work plans for each of these special sessions. They are there to insure that the input of all Conference participants is respected, and many participants as possible are heard in the limited time available. Perhaps most importantly, they are there to insure that the Conference achieves its intended purpose, and participants get what they need and want from the Conference.
